In 2024, The Eagle's Nest continued to be a sanctuary for individuals and groups seeking rest, healing, and renewed vision. We were honored to host 21 transformative retreats that helped people recalibrate their hearts, minds, and spirits. These retreats included a diverse array of gatherings — from leadership off-sites and spiritual getaways to worship nights and equipping weekends — each designed to help people reconnect with their purpose, find healing, and rediscover their calling.

But what set this year apart was the rest people found here. More than a retreat destination, The Eagle's Nest offers a different kind of rest — one that goes beyond physical relaxation and touches the soul in a deep and lasting way. Rest, in our world, can sometimes feel like a luxury — brief, interrupted, or fleeting — but here at The Nest, rest is both intentional and transformative. It's an opportunity for deep renewal, where people come to experience the kind of rest that restores the soul — *unusually good rest*.

"All the personal retreat and intimate worship times I've spent at the Unbridled Eagle's Nest house in Elizabeth over the years have been what I image it must be like entering through the doorway of Heaven! Whatever need or troubles I brought with me were no match at all for the overwhelming peace and presence of the Lord abiding there. 2024 marked a year of transition for Mizizi and those we serve in Uganda. We moved into a new ministry house in Jinja, equipped our Ugandan leaders with various trainings for ministry and welcomed back a dear old friend, Anna Olara, to our staff. More than just a physical shift, these changes have ushered us into a new season, full of exciting possibilities.

Our previous home primarily served as a place of rest, allowing those we serve the space to heal from past traumas. For Esther, her children, Maureen, Jackson, and others, it was a time to discover what life looks like beyond survival mode. Now, as we transition into this new house, we are reminded that home is more than respite — it can also be a place of renewal, purpose, and transformation. We're shifting from a restful winter to the blossoming of spring, fostering growth, intentional action, and community engagement. This new environment will cultivate a sense of belonging, using the foundational goodness of home as a springboard for pursuing God's greater vision.

Our Jinja House, surrounded by nature and beauty, offers peace that embodies the heart of Africa in its purest form. For Jackson, it's the little things — like clean water from a faucet and the comfort of ceiling fans — that show the community's progress. Yet, it's not just about physical amenities; the true value of this home is its ability to foster spiritual, emotional, and communal growth. Here, those we serve are encouraged to move from a mindset of entitlement to one of personal responsibility and accountability. We are transitioning from a time of waiting to actively pursuing God's vision for the community.

Similarly, Anna's return to the States for a few years allowed her to receive the healing she needed. While away from Uganda, Anna had the chance to explore life as a single mom, equipping herself with new skills in trauma-informed care and counseling. With her return to Uganda and reuniting with her adopted son, Caleb, Anna brings these instrumental skills back to serve Mizizi. Alongside our Ugandan leaders, she is ready to help others experience the same transformation; creating space for hard conversations and shared dreams where we thrive together, and the beauty of community is made real every day.





For individuals, like Bev, the excitement lies in knowing that with this space and support, we can dream bigger and bolder than ever before. Mizizi is no longer just a place where people come to be poured into but a place that overflows with the spirit of generosity, inviting others to serve and contribute as well. Here, we learn that while helping others can be challenging, it is always worth it when done with respect, love, and care. Personal transformation and communal development are intertwined, woven into the fabric of our new home.

At Mizizi we strive to live out our namesake, remaining *rooted* in faith, community, and the goodness of a shared home. A home built on community is richer than one of isolation — though it can be challenging, it is ultimately good. We are learning to share a vision far greater than any one individual.

As 2024 comes to a close, Mizizi stands at the threshold of spring — dreaming, building, and deepening connections. With our new house, Anna's leadership, and the collective heart of the community, we are moving forward into a hopeful future and the unusually good gift of home.

Love Hard

Since 2018, Love Hard has served as a means to create community for families and support those who have lost a child. Child bereavement is one of the more common phenomena with the least amount of support and Love Hard addresses this need in a very unique and specific way. It has been an honor and joy to work alongside the Kamins Family to create a program that provides opportunities for families to be intentional in their healing journey after loss. Love Hard is a testament that, though grief isn't linear and never goes away, it can be used in unusually good ways. To the right are some words from Jen & John Kamins, sharing their heart and the ways Love Hard has grown and expanded this year.

The heart of Love Hard is simple yet profound: to offer grieving families the space, support, and strength they need to heal after the unimaginable loss of a child. Our story began in 2015 when our son, Cash, joined our family. He was our light, our youngest, and the heartbeat of our home. Despite a challenging start — multiple surgeries at birth and 41 days in the NICU — Cash lived vibrantly, pulling everyone closer and making the ordinary feel extraordinary. When we lost him in 2017, the void was immeasurable, but even in our deepest grief, the love Cash brought into our lives was undeniable. It became our calling: to love with all we have, to embrace life fully, and to help grieving families along their unique healing journey.

Grief after the loss of a child is something no family should walk through alone. Love Hard creates spaces of togetherness where families can reconnect, breathe, and rediscover joy. Whether it's an all-expense-paid family retreat providing a safe haven for healing or a small grant serving as a lifeline, our support goes beyond gestures — it's a step toward healing, made possible by the love and generosity of our community.

2024 was a year of tremendous impact. Through the 4th Annual Love Hard 5k Fun Run, we raised over \$37,500 with the help of 299 runners, 225 donors, and 25 volunteers. These funds helped support six families in total, providing grants and resources and a retreat for one family to heal and reconnect. We also found a new collaborative opportunity with Project Sol Flower, a nonprofit based out of Colorado that helps terminally ill young adults fulfill bucket-list dreams and create cherished memories. This partnership has allowed us to connect with more families who have lost a child, fulfilling our shared commitment to offer community to those experiencing child bereavement.

Looking ahead, we are filled with gratitude and excitement for 2025. We hope to expand our capacity to care for more families, directed to us through our partnerships with Ronald McDonald House Charities of San Diego and Project Sol Flower.

To our incredible supporters, volunteers, and friends: Thank you for believing in Love Hard. Thank you for honoring Cash's legacy and walking alongside us on this journey. Most of all, thank you for showing up with open hearts and hands.

Love Hard is more than a name. It's a reminder that even in life's hardest moments, love always has the power to lift us up. We invite you to continue walking this path with us, keeping Cash's spirit and our mission alive as we move forward together.

It was wonderful to catch up with many families we cared for last year and to meet new Transforma women and children.

Our service team worked with every program Transforma has to offer, including their child sponsorship program, feeding center, trauma-healing retreats, and entrepreneurship program. Though UnbridledACTS monetarily supports these programs from afar every year, it is an honor to give back in a more tangible, hands-on way. Witnessing Transforma in action and lending our own time and talents to their work allows us to see, firsthand, how service can transform lives — not just for those we help, but for all those who take part in giving.

This year, through our partnership with Transforma, we have seen the power of unusually good service in action, impacting vulnerable communities in large ways.

- 23,585 meals donated to ultra-poor families, single mothers, vulnerable children, survivors of domestic violence, refugees and immigrants
- 224 healthcare services provided
- 138 school supply packages donated
- 67 special scholarships for medication, transportation, household items, and more
- 40 female entrepreneurs trained
- 317 local and international volunteers

"Traveling to Costa Rica was life-changing. Seeing the 20/20/60 model directly impact lives face-to-face is an experience I'll never forget. One standout moment was building bunk beds for kids who had been sleeping on the floor — a simple act that brought them immense joy and meant the world to them.

In our world full of abundance and excess, we often take so much for granted. Yet, they showed me things I aspire to — finding joy in the smallest things, fostering a close-knit community filled with love and laughter, and creating opportunities against all odds. In many ways, they changed me more than I changed them.

Our own team was able to feed 140 people during our service trip, as well as building three bunk beds for children previously sleeping on the ground, purchasing and distributing produce to 27 sponsored families, supporting four female entrepreneurs, and donating a variety of items including over a year supply of vitamins.

"My trip to Costa Rica was an eye opening and deeply impactful learning experience. It helped me gain a deeper understanding of the struggles faced by individuals in communities less fortunate than my own. While I recognized that we all face challenges, this tip reminded me that there are others whose hardship are far greater. Despite the differences in circumstances, the resilience, kindness, and gratitude of these women I have encountered left a lasting impression on me. This trip was not only transformative for me but also those that we had the privilege of helping. Seeing the smiles on people's faces as we contributed to their wellbeing was incredible rewarding. One of the most unexpected but meaningful aspects of the trip was the strong bond that was formed with my teammates. Working together in such a meaningful way brought us closer, fostering a sense of community and camaraderie that has extended well beyond this trip. This experience has shaped my perspective, reinforcing that even the simplest gesture can make a significant impact on someone's life. Over the last five years in Cañon City, partnerships have played a large role in our mission to restore people and places. As UnbridledACTS dipped our toe into solving the housing crisis, we linked arms with other organizations in both preparation and development plans. Loaves & Fishes Ministry of Fremont County has been one of many consistent partners. Our shared heart and likeminded initiatives have allowed us to make greater strides together, serving those who are homeless in the area.

In Fremont County, Loaves & Fishes is the primary support for the homeless community, providing meals, shelter, and other essential services to those in need. Their dedication to providing for individuals and families experiencing homelessness has been a beacon of hope in the community. From service opportunities to feeding those in need together, our organizations have operated in a spirit of collaboration throughout our community efforts.

At the end of 2022, UnbridledACTS committed funds to support Loaves & Fishes in the completion of their three-phase expansion project. This year, UnbridledACTS donated \$80,000 to close out phase two of their project: a self-select food pantry and clothing warehouse — a critical project that will expand their ability to serve even more locals in need. The completion of this phase came just in time to celebrate Loaves & Fishes Ministry of Fremont County's 40-year anniversary.



Cheyenne has been with Unbridled for 5 years, starting as an intern. She is currently an Event Technology Manager on our Solutions Event Tech team and has utilized the Identity Fund throughout her time at Unbridled.

When I tell people that one of the benefits of my company is helping pay for therapy, they are always floored. "That's incredible," they say. As a society, we've definitely gotten better at acknowledging mental health and providing resources, but it still seems taboo. People feel that something must be "wrong" with them if they go to therapy. First, nothing is wrong with you, and second, therapy, at least from my perspective, is a way for you to get guidance on things you are thinking and feeling, discussing those in a safe space.

In July 2020, my mom passed away from breast cancer, and a year later, I wasn't feeling like myself; things that usually brought me joy I avoided, and I started struggling in my relationship with my boyfriend. It was actually my boyfriend who encouraged me to go to therapy, so I could process my grief and start to feel like myself again.

That's how I started my Identity Fund journey. I was worried about my meeting with UnbridledACTS to even begin the program, but it was super smooth, and they recommended someone to me very quickly. Shortly following that meeting, I got in contact with the suggested therapist, and my first session was scheduled. I immediately connected with the therapist, which was encouraging as I was worried I would have to try a couple therapists, knowing ACTS would work with me to find the right fit. I cried throughout that first session realizing how raw my grief still was. My first year and a half in therapy, I was going once a week, and as I made progress, I started going every other week, and now I'm on a month-to-month basis.

While on my personal therapy journey, my boyfriend and I hit a real rough time in our relationship, so I reached out again to ACTS to start couples therapy. The process was just as smooth as the first time, and we connected with the first therapist we saw. We have been seeing our couple's provider once a week and have made so much progress in a year together.

Being in therapy has not only helped me process my grief, preparing for it to be something I live with the rest of my life as it ebbs and flows in intensity, but it has also helped me navigate ways to express and process my emotions in a healthy way. I've learned how to get out of my own head, talk down negative self-talk, and be the best me that I can be. I've started getting back into my hobbies and honestly feel like I'm me again; the best I can be right now, accepting that I'm not perfect and will continue to have lows to work through with the tools I've learned in therapy. Couples therapy has strengthened my relationship with my boyfriend and taught us how to handle conflict in our relationship and express our feelings with each other.

Therapy has also helped me show up better in my work, learning how to get through different situations that come up in a professional environment. I try to use the tools I've learned in my personal therapy to engage better with my colleagues and process difficult clients and events. I'm working through imposter syndrome since taking on my new role with even more eyes on me, trying not to let my self-doubt take over.

Since starting my mental health journey, I'm no longer afraid to tell others that I'm in therapy or to discuss mental health. I believe open discussion helps further normalize therapy without something being "wrong" with you and helps others feel that they aren't alone in their experiences or what they feel. We are all human, and it can be hard trying to express our thoughts or where to even begin in navigating all the things life throws at us. For me, therapy has helped immensely. Therapy is normal, and I'm so thankful to UnbridledACTS for the Identity Fund. I would recommend it to anyone.





Dry Bones Denver is a nonprofit dedicated to providing a long-standing community of support for Denver's unhoused teens and young adults.

Their support includes street outreach, emotional & spiritual support, weekly gatherings & meals, job readiness training, accessible showers & laundry, and advocacy. Simply put, their heart is to be a friend to young people on the streets. Below is an interview with Matt Wallace, the Executive Director of Dry Bones.

WHY DID YOU DECIDE THE IDENTITY FUND WAS A BENEFIT YOU WANTED TO OFFER YOUR PEOPLE?

When we were given the opportunity to participate in the Identity Fund, it felt like an answered prayer. The challenges of nonprofit work often feel like balancing on a tightrope between service and self-sacrifice. The Identity Fund gives our team the means to access care that supports their hearts, minds, and souls so they can sustain this work. It is helping us to serve others more wholly and sustainably.

HOW HAS THE IDENTITY FUND HELPED OR POSITIVELY IMPACTED YOUR STAFF?

The Identity Fund has truly enriched our team by offering an accessible way to address personal healing and resilience. Given our work's proximity to trauma and hardship, this fund provides a resource to help each of us process and replenish. It's rare to find a benefit so aligned with both personal and organizational well-being.

WHAT, IF ANY, DIFFERENCES HAVE YOU NOTICED IN YOUR ORGANIZATION SINCE PROVIDING THE IDENTITY FUND TO YOUR STAFF?

We've noticed a palpable shift in our team's morale and resilience. As a group, we're more present and more deeply engaged with our mission. I believe that this fund has reduced burnout, allowing team members to seek support proactively. There's a greater sense of wholeness and inner balance that strengthens our collective spirit and ability to serve. While I don't know which individuals access the fund due to privacy, I regularly hear words of gratitude for the opportunity.

ANYTHING ELSE YOU'D LIKE TO SHARE?

The Identity Fund has exceeded our expectations. It's empowering staff to explore their inner landscapes, move through personal shadows, and bring more of themselves to their work. It's an investment in their humanity, and it's inspiring to see how that radiates out to impact those we serve.

Speaking personally, my relationship with my therapist has been simply life changing. He has supported and guided me through various inner-challenges and shadows, and has empowered me to lead from a deeper, more still place. He's helped me live more soulfully and authentically. I find that I can face the trauma of others, the stressors of running a nonprofit, and leading a team with more equanimity and flow. I'm forever grateful for the financial access and opportunity to work with such a gifted counselor.



ASKING FOR HELP IS UNUSUALLY GOOD

Response Fund

The Unbridled Response Fund is our way of coming alongside those in our community who are experiencing unexpected financial hardship. By the people, for the people; Unbridled employees donate monthly to the Response Fund and UnbridledACTS matches donations \$2 for every \$1. From these funds, Unbridled employees can reach out for Fund support for themselves or others in need. Oftentimes, the Response Fund is the only grant program that allows for an applicant to hear someone else's voice on the other end of the line, forming a relationship through the approval process. Our hope is to help those in need feel that they are not alone while providing a safe place to ask for and receive help. The following is a testimonial from Kelly Hueseman, one of our 22 Response Fund applicants this year.



"When the storm hit, I never expected it would be as bad as it was. I had been away for Memorial Day weekend with family and friends, about 45 minutes away from home. We had no idea the storm was going to be anything more than a passing rain. But when I got an unexpected call from my neighbors, I knew something was wrong. "Your house is in bad shape and the car in your driveway is totaled. You might want to head home..."

The moment I arrived home and saw the damage; it felt like the world was in slow motion. Everything was destroyed — our brand-new landscaping was ruined, the siding on our house looked like it had been shot with a machine gun from top to bottom, the fence had holes throughout, the mailbox and garage door were dimpled with hail damage, and the roof was destroyed. I was a first-time homeowner, we had just moved in the year prior, and I never expected to see a sight like this. Holding my 22-month-old son, I suddenly felt the unbearable weight of everything — scheduling repairs, facing the high deductible of my homeowner's insurance, coordinating with contractors, and just trying to keep it all together for my family.

A few weeks later I had a call with Carrie Stewart, someone I really look up to at Unbridled and consider a mentor, both professionally and personally. We were swapping stories about the holiday weekend, and I told her about the devastation. Without hesitation, she suggested I apply to the Unbridled Response Fund. Honestly, I didn't even know the fund was available to employees, so her suggestion caught me off guard. At first, I was hesitant. I didn't feel like my situation was "worthy" of support. I know others have it worse, and I just assumed this was an unfortunate situation I'd have to deal with on my own. But Carrie reassured me, "You should apply. It's okay to ask for help when you need it. And this is an instance where you are in need."

The following week, I connected with Lorelei and Emmie to learn about the Response Fund and submitted my application. I didn't know what to expect and filling out the form was a bit of an emotional journey. It forced me to really sit down and assess everything — how much the storm had impacted us, how much it was going to cost to fix things, and how much stress it had caused. But as I filled the application out, it became clear: I was in need, and this was an opportunity for me to receive some support.

Once I submitted the application, there was a sense of peace. I wasn't sure what would happen next, but I knew I had been heard. And that alone felt comforting. The waiting wasn't as nerve-wracking as I had expected. It felt good to know that no matter what, there were people looking out for me.

When I found out I was approved, I was at work and received the good news on a call with Lorelei and Emmie. I felt immediate relief, as if a physical weight was lifted off my shoulders. Unexpectedly, the funds were deposited almost immediately, which was unexpected and such a blessing. I didn't expect the process to be so seamless, so stress-free, and so quick. The immediate support allowed me to focus on moving forward, and I got started right away, hiring contractors and scheduling repairs.

The entire process was much easier than I'd anticipated, and it was emotional. I saw that this wasn't just my company doing a nice thing; it was love in action. Now I understand what it feels like to be on the receiving end of the radical generosity we've all heard Stan describe.

Looking back, I want people to understand that the Response Fund is for you. It's for all of us — whether you're going through something big or small. If you find yourself in a tough spot, don't hesitate to ask for help. There's no situation too small or too insignificant. We all have moments where we need a little extra support, and that's exactly what the Response Fund is for. It's a reflection of everything Unbridled stands for. It's not about rank or position — it's about community, love, and generosity. Carrie opened my eyes to that. She lovingly reminded me that we're all part of this community, and everyone is worthy of care.

The UnbridledACTS team and the Response Fund is a beautiful example of the culture we're cultivating at Unbridled. It's not just about business or profits; it's about taking care of people. It's about showing up for others when they need help, and doing it with integrity, honor, and love.

I am so grateful for the support I received. It impacted my life in the most positive and genuine way, and it reminded me that we are all connected — through ACTS, through the work we do, and through the generosity that flows from one person to another.

If there's one thing I'd want people to take away from my experience, it's this: asking for help is not something to be ashamed of. In fact, it's an incredibly good thing to do. We live in a world that can sometimes make us feel like we have to do everything on our own, but the truth is, none of us should have to do it alone. The Response Fund is proof of that. It's a lifeline that says, "You don't have to carry this burden by yourself. We're here for you." And that, to me, is what makes the Response Fund such a beautiful and powerful thing."







In 2024, UnbridledACTS partnered with Unbridled Media, creating an opportunity for their employees to engage in service while directing a portion of their 20% giveback to the causes they hold most dear. We called the initiative the Purpose Fund, connecting their team members' professional success with meaningful giveback. Megg Alvizo met with each Media employee to discover the service areas they care most about. From those discussions, we created two service opportunities with two St. Louis-based nonprofits that serve local youth and prioritize community sustainability. Any team member who volunteered was then gifted an allotted amount to donate to a select charity of their choice. In the end, 12 employees engaged in service, donating their time and funds to local organizations doing great work for youth and sustainability in the greater St. Louis area.

Matching Funds – The Bridge Youth Center

Every year, we set aside matching funds that allow us to multiply generosity for initiatives or organizations that share our same heart to love people to life. We know that if we link arms with like-hearted efforts, we can expand our reach far beyond what we could do on our own. This year, we hosted eight matching funds for a variety of causes from hurricane disaster relief to dementia research.

It is always exciting to offer matching funds to those we regularly partner with, like The Bridge Youth Center in Fremont County. The Bridge offers a safe place for youth to spend time in Cañon City when not in school. Staff members and volunteers form healthy relationships with the youth, offering them mentorship and spiritual direction. From mid-March to mid-April, we held a matching fund of up to \$5,000 for The Bridge, raising funds for their summer programming. In the end, we raised \$12,792, covering program and staff expenses for nine weeks of summer events. Successful partnerships like these remind us how unusually good it is when we work together toward a common goal. The following is a note of thanks from the Director of The Bridge.

With your help, our organization was able to conduct a vibrant summer programming opportunity for over 100 students in our community, many of whom were regular attendees in our nine weeks of summer activities. These weeks included the facilitation of field trips to go roller blading, nerf war battling, touring the Denver Art Museum, and more! Each week, students were also given the opportunity to acquire culinary skills through the preparation of nutritious snacks, which were then enjoyed by all attendees. A well-remembered aspect of our summer was the Camping Trip, where 20 students were immersed in a wilderness setting. There, they met the reality of authentic fellowship outside of the bounds of social media and peer groups, were encouraged to take steps of trust in areas beyond their control, grew in their understanding of how they contribute to their community by being their authentic selves, and had very real encounters with God through His Word, by His Spirit, and through the wonders of creation all around them.

UnbridledACTS' support of our organization this summer allowed us to bring on three interns to facilitate the programming, but they each brought so much more to the table. These interns brought their gifts of intentional love for our youth, musical and artistic abilities, creative ideas to challenge the false identities of many students who frequented the summer landscape of our ministry, and, ultimately, a love for the Lord that rippled throughout the days and weeks that made up what is now remembered as Bridge Summer 2024. To call it a "breath of fresh air" would certainly be an understatement in accurately describing what these interns did. They were vessels of God's boundless love to His beloved. This is what we look for and seek to cultivate in our pursuit of youth. This is what The Bridge is all about! Loving youth in a way that brings about new life through the investments made.







